(12 Hours Listening & Speaking Course / 12 Hours Reading & Writing Course / 2 Hours Speaking Course)

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT B1 (INTERMEDIATE) LEVEL

At the end of the B1 (Beginner) level, students are expected to understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. They will be able to deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken. They can also produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Additionally, they can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

COURSE LENGTH:

The Intermediate level (B1) spans 8 weeks in total. Students receive 12 hours of Listening & Speaking classes, 12 hours of Reading & Writing classes and 2 hours Speaking Classes per week. After completing the final (8th) week, students take the final exam.

MATERIALS:

Listening & Speaking: Cambridge University Press, UNLOCK 3 Listening, Speaking & Critical Thinking Student's Book

Reading & Writing: Cambridge University Press, UNLOCK 3, Reading, Writing & Critical Thinking Student's Book

Speaking Course: Speaking task sections of UNLOCK 3: Listening, Speaking & Critical Thinking Student's Book (In this 2-hour speaking course, the speaking task sections of Unlock 3: Listening, Speaking & Critical Thinking are covered. Throughout the lessons, students have the opportunity to improve their speaking skills through interactive activities such as giving presentations, participating in debates, and engaging in structured discussions. These tasks help students develop fluency, confidence, and critical thinking while communicating in English.)

Note: Information about additional resources, online practice platforms, speaking & writing tasks is provided via Google Classroom.

ASSESSMENT:

Throughout the module, students are assessed through multiple components designed to evaluate their performance in all major language skills. The overall grading for the B1 level is distributed as follows:

B1 Level Assessment: 30% Mid-Exam + 30% Portfolio + 40% Final Exam

• Mid-Exam: 100 points (Sections: Listening, Reading, Language in Use, Writing, Speaking)

• Portfolio: 100 points

- ❖ Online Practice: Platform-based quizzes & exercises, covering Listening, Reading, Language in Use (40 pts) These online tasks are based on:
 - ✓ Unlock 3 Listening, Speaking & Critical Thinking Student's Book (Cambridge University Press) 20% of the Online Practice score,
 - ✓ Unlock 3 Reading, Writing & Critical Thinking Student's Book (Cambridge University Press) 20% of the Online Practice score.
- ❖ Progress Test: Listening, Reading, and Language in Use (40 pts) (Students who do not have the coursebook and therefore cannot complete the Online Practice section can take the Progress Test instead.)
- **❖ Writing Tasks:** 3 short tasks (emails, paragraphs, reflections, etc.) (3 x 10 pts = 30 pts)
- ❖ Speaking Tasks: 3 speaking tasks (video recordings, role-plays, short presentations, etc.) (3 x 10 pts = 30 pts)
- Final Exam: 100 points (Sections: Listening, Reading, Language in Use, Writing, Speaking)

To complete the B1 module successfully, students are required to:

- ❖ obtain at least 60 out of 100 points on the Final Exam,
- * score at least 60 in the overall assessment.

ABSENTEEISM:

Students need to be present in at least 85% of the classes.
