Important Exam Regulations

1. Entry to the Exam Room and ID Check

- Students must be present in the exam room at least 15 minutes before the exam starts.
- Students must present at least one of the following documents: A valid **official photo ID** (national ID card, passport, driver's license) or a **Student ID** card.
- Students without valid identification will not be admitted to the exam.
- The use of mobile phones, smart watches, tablets, digital translation devices, electronic dictionaries, or any other electronic devices is strictly prohibited.
- All devices must be turned off and handed in to the area designated by the invigilator before the exam begins.

2. Late Arrivals

- The exam starts with the Listening section; no students are allowed to enter the exam room during this section.
- Late-comers will remain outside until the listening section is over and will be allowed in only afterward.
- Students who arrive within the first **20 minutes** of the exam may take the exam; however, no extra time will be given.

3. During the Exam

- The Written Exam consists of four sections:
 - Listening
 - Reading
 - o Language in Use
 - Writing
- In the Listening section, students listen to two different audio recordings and answer the questions.
- In the Reading section, students answer questions based on two or three texts.
- The Language in Use section consists of:
 - o Grammar
 - Vocabulary
- In the A1 and A2 Writing sections, students complete two writing tasks, each worth 10 points.
- In the B1 Writing section, students complete one writing task worth 20 points.

- Answers for the Listening, Reading, and Language in Use sections must be marked on the Optical Answer
 Sheet.
- The optical form must be filled in with a pencil only.
- In the Speaking Session, students complete **two** speaking tasks, **each worth 10 points**.
- Absolute silence must be maintained throughout the exam. Talking, exchanging items, or any form of communication is strictly forbidden.
- Students who cheat or violate exam rules will be subject to the provisions of the Higher Education Institutions Student Disciplinary Regulation (No. 28388).
- Students can only leave the exam room accompanied by a member of SFL in case of an urgent situation.

4. Leaving the Exam Room

- Students are not allowed to leave the exam room within the first 30 minutes.
- After the first 30 minutes, students who have completed the exam must:
 - Submit all exam materials completely
 - Leave the room quietly
- Students who leave the exam room will not be allowed to re-enter during the exam period.

5. Assessment Criteria

- Listening, Reading, and Language in Use sections are evaluated based on the answer key.
 - Incorrect answers do not cancel correct answers.
- Writing tasks are assessed independently by two assessors. The average of the two scores is taken as the final writing score.
- Speaking tasks are conducted individually and are assessed by two examiners using standardized assessment criteria to ensure reliability and fairness.
